

SUMMARY OF GUIDELINES

For how long may I speak?

- For up to **3** minutes, although it is helpful if you are briefer.
- You may speak once only on any one subject, unless the Chairman asks you for further information.
- You cannot speak on confidential issues (or be present).
- You cannot take part in Councillors' debate.
- If the Chairman judges any remarks to be defamatory, frivolous or offensive he/she may reject them and require you to stop speaking.

Speaking at Full Council Meetings

At a meeting of the full **Council**, if you wish to speak at the meeting, the Councillors need to formally vote to allow this, unless it is concerning a recommendation from Committee minutes.

Speaking at other Committee Meetings

At other Committee (Sub-Committee and Working Party) Meetings, the Chairman will tell you when you may speak.

Taking Part in Town Council Meetings

Public Participation Information

Members of the public have the right to attend meetings of their Town Council. You may also 'have your say' at these meetings, subject to certain guidelines.

What regular Meetings does the Town Council hold?

There is a formal **Full Council Meeting** chaired by the Town Mayor, attended by all 14 Councillors. There are three other Committees, made up of 8 Councillors including the Town Mayor and the Deputy Town Mayor:

- **Policy & Finance Committee**
- **Planning, Town & Environment Committee**
- **Recreation, Leisure & Open Spaces Committee**

How do I find out more about Town Council meetings?

Each meeting has an agenda listing items to be considered, and the date each meeting is to be held. The agenda is published at least three working days prior to the date of the meeting. Our agenda are displayed in the three public noticeboards (outside the Town Council offices, 71 Christchurch Road, at Bisterne Village Hall and outside Tesco, Poulner) and on our website: www.ringwood.gov.uk. For the **Planning, Town & Environment**

Committee, a list of the planning applications to be considered is also displayed.

Please note that the **Planning, Town & Environment Committee** of this Council can only itself *comment*, not make a decision, on a **planning application**. The decision is made by New Forest District Council. If there are objections, this decision is usually made at NFDC's Planning Development Control Committee meeting—for further information please contact NFDC on 023 8028 5345 (www.nfdc.gov.uk/planning).

Minutes of meetings are published on the website, or available to read in the office, by arrangement. Individual copies may be requested, although there may be a charge for this. Ringwood Library also has reference copies of all minutes.

When can I have my say?

- 1) Any Issue:** at all our Meetings, there is an opportunity for you to have your say on matters which are **not** on the Agenda, before the Meeting formally begins. Up to 10 minutes are available and you may speak on any matter (within the Terms of Reference of the Committee). Formal decisions cannot be made on matters which are not on the Agenda.
- 2) Agenda Items:** in addition to this, you may speak during the meeting, but only on items on the Agenda (immediately before the item is discussed). Up to 10 minutes are available and this time will be allocated by the Chairman according to the Town Council's rules (*for further guidelines, please see back page of this leaflet*).

Where are meetings held?

Full Council meetings are held at the New Forest District Council Public Offices, 65 Christchurch Road, Ringwood. Other Committee meetings are held at the Ringwood Town Council

offices, 'Greenways', 71 Christchurch Road. The location of a meeting is published on the agenda.

Parking

There is roadside parking on Christchurch Road. There is disabled parking and access at the rear of 71 Christchurch Road and at 65 Christchurch Road.

When should I arrive?

Please arrive at least 5 minutes before the meeting starts and make yourself known to the Chairman or a member of staff.

Should I let anyone know I will be attending a meeting?

Time will be allocated on a 'first come, first served' basis. If you plan to attend a meeting, it greatly helps the smooth running of the meeting if you can let us know in advance.
