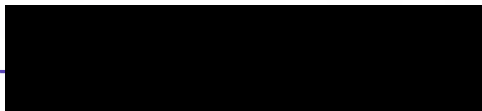

Thank you for your letter and application form of 25.05.10.

I have completed the application form as fully as possible and include the most up to date accounts for Poulner Baptist Chapel.

I am also including this letter so that the grants application board may have as much information available to them as possible in helping them with their decision

In order to clarify who we are, I am a retired G.P. and one of the members of the fellowship at Poulner Baptist Chapel (PBC) and I am acting on behalf of PBC in the application for this grant.

The fellowship has existed in Ringwood for the last 170 years and has a current membership of 190 and another 100 + adherents. We are an independent Baptist Church totally self-funding.

Over the last ten years the church has increased in size and we have embarked on a new church building project to make room for the many more people that are coming to the church both to worship and to partake in the many other activities that are held at the church.

We are very much involved with the local community and we use the church and our facilities for: -

- 1) At least 100 youngsters come up to the church on a Sunday morning 90% of whom are from "unchurched" backgrounds. We have a full time trainee youth pastor who is very involved with leading the youth work.

- 2) At least 65 youngsters use the church and the various facilities on Friday evenings each week and occasionally on other evenings as well.
- 3) There is a luncheon club run for elderly folk in the town (no requirement to belong to the church to attend the luncheon club). We are hoping that with the new building in place we will be able to increase the use of the luncheon club from once a month to twice a month. At present 45 attend the luncheon club.
- 4) There is a very active mothers and toddlers session held morning and afternoon on Fridays. Approximately 27 children with 23 mothers in the morning session and 16 children with 15 mothers in the afternoon. The majority of the mothers are not members of the church.
- 5) The new sanctuary area has a seating capacity of 350 and can be adapted for use for other functions, such as conferences.

Moving on to the actual building project, as you will see from the enclosed building plans, the project has been divided into a number of phases

Phase 1 The construction of the toilets and the relocation of the electrics.
Cost £163,000. All fully completed and paid for.

Phase 2&3 Building of the Sanctuary and foyer area, alteration of current church building into a community hall and new kitchen. External site works to include landscaping for the car park, as required by the local planning department.
Cost £1.03 million. We have so far raised £836,000 towards this part of The project through general giving, the sale of two church properties and interest free loans from members. In addition we have guaranteed provision for a £200,000 mortgage should we require it.

Phase 4 Conversion of old schoolrooms to new administration office, two new general purpose meeting rooms and a new plant room containing new boilers.
Cost £49,000 All fully completed and paid for.

Fixtures and fittings: Costs £94,000

Professional fees : Costs £106,000

I enclose a copy of the most recent audited accounts. Poulner Baptist Church is currently in the process of completing its Charity registration.

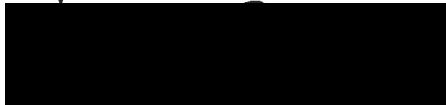
In summary Poulner Baptist Chapel is in the process of enlarging and improving our current premises so as to be able to cope with the increasing demands on the present

buildings. I would emphasise the point that the church exists for “non-members” and is open to anyone and everyone in our community.

The total cost of the whole project is £1.3 million of which we have now secured all but £200,000.

We would intend to put any of the monies/grant that you would consider awarding us towards either the £2000 cost of an industrial cooker or towards the £8000 cost of the provision of additional seating.

Thank you for your time and help and I look forward to hearing from you in due course.

- 2) Further invoice about to be paid £151,000.
- 3) Money allocated for building (money in bank) £750,000.
- 4) Money required £200,000 Of this £104,000 is required for professional fees and £96,000 is needed for fixtures and fittings to equip the new building and rooms, including PA system, new kitchen appliances, additional seating, flooring and blinds.
