The initial recommendation for refusal (4) of the application was made on 5th October by the Committee. Members felt that this proposal was a cramped development, on this particular site, forward of the building line. They were also concerned with the lack of amenity space, parking provision and proposed access to the property.

The Deputy Town Clerk was approached following the meeting by the Planning Officer who indicated that she proposed to recommend refusal of the application, on the basis that it would represent a cramped form of development, relating poorly to the established layout and pattern of development in the vicinity. She didn't consider that she could refuse the application on these additional grounds, and in respect of highway safety, the Highway Authority was supportive, subject to condition.

This was considered by the Chairman and Vice-Chairman under delegated powers and on 31st October, it was confirmed that the Town Council has no objection to the refusal being issued on the grounds outlined by the Planning Officer.

DRAFT BUDGET 2019/2020

1. INTRODUCTION

- **1.1** Members are required to consider the budget proposals for 2019/20 for this Committee and to make recommendations to the Policy and Finance Committee.
- 1.2 To assist Members, the following draft documents are attached:-

Appendix A: Shows the progress made on the new expenditure items approved for inclusion in the 2018/19 budget together with proposals for new expenditure bids for 2019/20.

Appendix B: Shows the approved original budget 2018/19 of £19,691 (including non-recurring growth of £11,400, of which £8,000 is to be funded from reserves), the draft revised budget 2018/19 of £16,012 which reflects the forecast outturn for 2018/19 together with the first draft budget for 2019/20 of £16,700 which excludes any new bids.

For comparison, actual net expenditure in 2017/18 was \pounds 15,364 before transfers to and from provisions and \pounds 14,364 after transfers.

2. REVISED BUDGET 2018/19

2.1 The revised budget (column 4 Appendix B) shows a net decrease of £3,670 over the original budget (column 3). The main reasons for this are:-

- **2.2** The work on Crow Lane maintenance is funded by developer's contributions. This is being written down annually and the balance at the end of March 2019 will be £3,664.
- **2.3** The revised budget includes updated budgets in a number of areas where it is apparent that current budgets are unlikely to be spent and there is some evidence that the full budgets are not likely to be required in the current year.

3. FIRST DRAFT BUDGET 2019/20

3.1 The base budget for 2019/20 has been prepared on an incremental basis by rolling forward the 2018/19 budget and adjusting for non recurring expenditure and known inflationary cost changes. Other than for pay costs, there will only be general inflationary increases of 2.0% applied where budgets are typically largely spent or overspent. Other specific adjustments for inflation have been applied where these are known and unavoidable, e.g. for insurance.

- **3.2** Analysis of historic spend (from April 2013) across Town Council budgets has revealed a number of areas where budgets may no longer be required or may be reduced to release savings. Small savings have been identified within this Committee's budget which mitigate, to some extent, any inflationary increases.
- **3.3** Appendix B show sets out the summary budget figures for the Committee. The draft budget excludes any new expenditure bids. New bids that are being brought forward for consideration are set out in Appendix A.
- **3.4** The Committee is asked to consider the new bids in Appendix A and the draft budget proposals in Appendix B. These will then go forward to the Policy & Finance Committee later in December for consideration as part of the Council's total budget.
- **3.5** There will be a further opportunity to review the budget proposals at the next meeting of this Committee in January 2019.

4. NEW BIDS 2019/20

4.1 New non-recurring bids for 2019/20, amounting to £3,000, have been proposed. This is in respect of the Neighbourhood Plan work which was originally planned for 2018/19 but has been deferred. The funds for this work will be transferred to the General Fund and will be available in 2019/20.

5. **RECOMMENDATIONS**
