RACE TO GREEN TEAM PLANTING UPDATE

Members received a presentation from representatives of RACE to Green detailing the projects around town that the team of volunteers have undertaken and continue to maintain.

Initially, work started on the beds in the Gateway Square to improve the look of the area for local people and tourists and to provide more habitats, by introducing more pollinator friendly plants. Work has included assessing and improving the soil, mulching, removing litter, removal of dead and dying plants, bulb planting, etc. There is a lot of work also at the design stage to research the suitability of plants and to ensure they will survive in the conditions. The grounds team have

Page 1 of 3 Chairman's initi helped in sourcing materials, removing green waste and watering. Volunteers have worked on 12 sites around the town, as well as 18 tubs, and have plans for even more.

The Committee conveyed its thanks for attending the meeting and for the update. Appreciation was expressed for the fantastic work undertaken and the huge amount of effort from of all the volunteers to improve the planting around town and make those areas look beautiful. The savings to the Council were also acknowledged. Members were encouraged to support RACE events by promoting and attending them, as this helps to raise funds to continue the work of the team.

The Deputy Town Clerk reported that two applications for CIL funding had been submitted to NFDC. The bids are for a larger bus shelter in Gorley Road and a joint application (with Ellingham, Harbridge and Ibsley Parish Council) for speed indicator devices (SIDs).

<u>Thriving Market Place</u> – Following the Council's request for the scope of works, a response had been received from NFDC stating that it would not be appropriate to release the procurement documentation. The work with consultants is to draw up a concept plan. Some options will not go forward to the detailed design stage, but could be included in the overall scheme, if supported and if other funding becomes available.

Disappointment was expressed at the response received and that the scope of works will not be released for something fundamental to the town. District Councillor Haywood would take this forward and report back. The concept work will be brought before the Committee at its October meeting.

Review of speeding limits – Cllr Frederick was in communication with PC Bigland about the feasibility of community speed watch on Christchurch Road. It was noted the Police had recently deployed a speed gun and mobile camera in the area.
